FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE TO MHS STUDENTS

The cost of attending a school of further education varies for each institution. Included in the costs are tuition, fees, room and board, transportation, books and supplies, medical care, recreation, and personal expenses.

If these costs cannot be fully met by the student and the family, it may be advisable to apply for financial aid. There are three sources of financial aid: public funds (federal and state), colleges and universities, and private organizations.

Public funds include:

PELL GRANT

The Pell Grant is a federally funded program of direct financial grants to qualified students based on financial need alone. Some colleges require that the Pell Grant request be filed as one of the criteria for financial aid for the college. Eligibility is based on financial need. Applicants apply for Pell aid by filling out the FAFSA form.

PERKINS LOAN

The Perkins Loan is administered directly by college financial aid offices. Information and applications should be secured at the college.

CAPITOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

(formerly the Connecticut Scholastic Achievement Grant Program)

The Capitol Scholarship Program assists selected students who meet the eligibility requirements listed below who demonstrate financial need and who enroll in eligible institutions of post-secondary education. The number of awards, if any, is determined by available funding. Eligible applicants who are least able to contribute to college costs will receive priority. Applicants will be notified of awards before the May 1 Common Candidate Reply Date used by many colleges.

Applicant Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Be a legal resident of Connecticut
- 2. Have filed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by Feb. 15th, and received a valid Expected Family Contribution.
- 3. Be a secondary school senior or graduate
- 4. Have a cumulative class rank in the top 20% at the end of the junior year for high school seniors (upon graduation for all others) OR have combined scores (math, critical reading, writing) of at least 1,800 on any one sitting of the Scholastic Assessment Test or 27 or better on the ACT; and
- 5. Have not previously received a baccalaureate degree.

Eligible Institutions

Students may use the grant at any college or university in Connecticut, or in states which have reciprocal arrangements with Connecticut (the District of Columbia, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and Vermont).

Annual Award Schedule for Full-time Students

For students attending Connecticut colleges and universities:

4-year degree & 2-year private \$2,000 - \$3,000

2-year public\$500 - \$1,000

Students attending colleges out-of-state receive \$500 grants.

Awards will be adjusted accordingly for students who are enrolled at least half-time but less than full-time.

Award Disbursement

All awards are forwarded to colleges for deposit into student accounts. One half is forwarded for the fall term after the college confirms the student's eligibility. The balance is sent during the spring term following confirmation again. Awards may be applied toward tuition, fees, books, room and other legitimate educational expenses.

Application Procedure in Subsequent Years

Previous applicants do not have to submit a new application. You need only complete the Free Federal Student Aid Application.

Each year, Renewal Forms will be sent to eligible applicants. To re-apply in subsequent years, an applicant must submit a Renewal Form to the Capitol Scholarship Program. If you do not receive this form by late January, please contact the Department of High Education.

FORD LOAN and PLUS LOAN

These loans are now made by the U.S. Department of Education. Students and/or parents should look at the website www.studentloans.gov to learn more about these options.

Private and Institutional Funds include:

College funds — Most colleges award financial aid to needy students. This is often a "package" consisting of a grant, a loan, and work-study. Students apply directly to the financial aid office of the college, usually at the same time they apply to the college. Usually the FAFSA is required. Often page 1 of the Internal Revenue Service form 1040 is required. Students should consult college catalogues and/or the financial aid office of the college for more details as to the application procedure and filing deadline.

Private organizations such as those listed in the remainder of this booklet also award financial aid to students. Selection criteria, application procedures, and deadlines vary. Interested students should be certain to file all applications completely and on time.

Church groups, ethnic groups, employers, fraternal and service clubs, unions, and special interest groups also award financial aid. Students who are members or whose parents are members of these groups should consult the group's president for further information.

National competitions are additional sources of financial aid. These include:

- National Honor Society (nominees selected by local chapter)
- National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT), which is given at Manchester High School in mid to late October of the junior year
